Roche Maigres vocational high school was approached by the town of Saint-Louis as part of the project 《Fah'âme trail》 at the request of Mrs Juliana M'Doihoma, mayor of the city. The trail, which runs from Saint Philippe to Le Tévelave, crosses several cities, including Saint-Louis. The project involved designing the 4 totem poles that will mark out the places along the trail that are steeped in history and cross the city. The lst year class of the brevet des métiers d'art in cabinet making designed and built these structures: Canal des Aloès, Le Tapage, L'Observatoire des Makes and Parc des Platanes.

The totem pole in front of you, Le Tapage, was created after being selected by elected members of the town council from all the projects submitted. It provides information about the history of this area during the period of slavery, when slaves were freed to hide from the colonists.

Le Tapage is a district of Rivière Saint-Louis. It is a mountain 621 metres above sea level. It is located near the locality of La Ligne Chevalier and Ilet Furcy.


The totem pole shows - the route of the trail - the Fah'âme logo - the town hall logo - the name of the trail - It is supported by a metal structure







